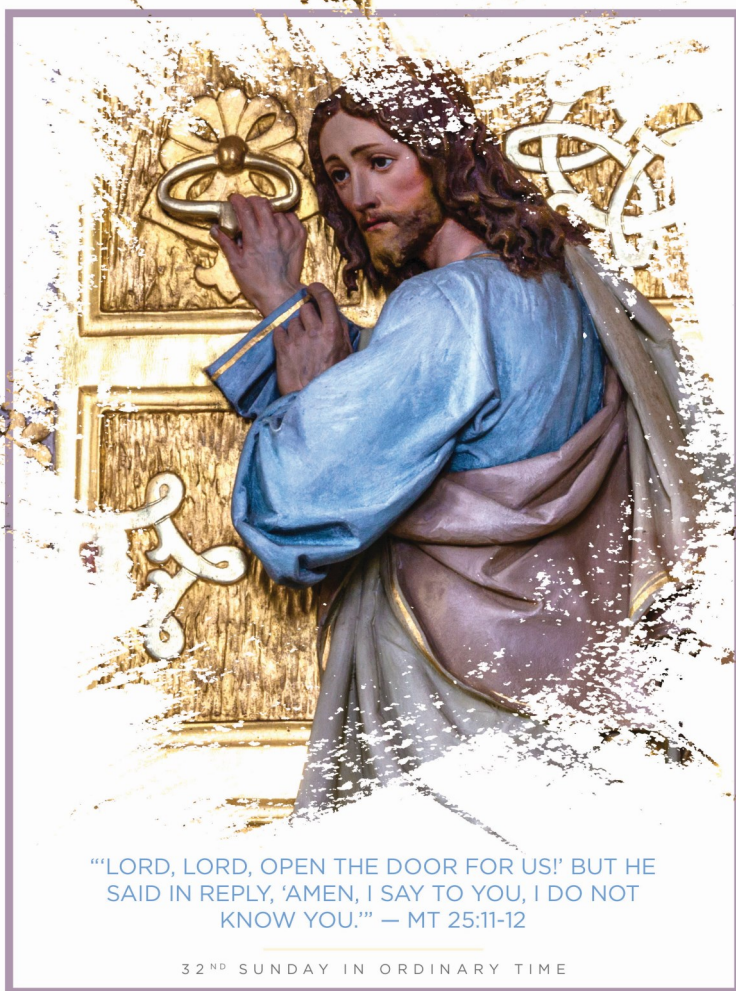

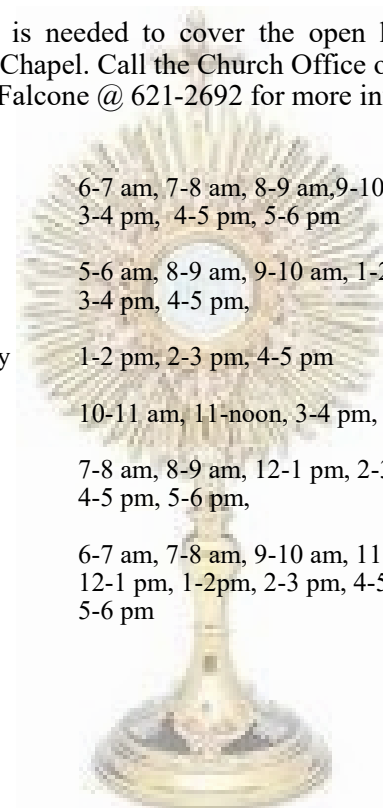

Dear Parishioners,

As we approach the 32nd week of the liturgical year, we find ourselves with only two weeks remaining in this current liturgical cycle. Time has flown by, and it's an excellent opportunity to reflect on our spiritual journey. St. Jerome once wisely said, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." I am delighted to share that 40 people have signed up for the Bible class led by Deacon Bruce Fortnum, and many others have joined the RCIA program to refresh and deepen their faith. It's a testament to your commitment to growing in your relationship with God. Additionally, there are numerous resources available for faith formation in our modern age, and I encourage you to make use of them. Catholic Radio of South Carolina (Columbus Club of Florence tune into 93.3 FM) is one such resource, and EWTN provides solid, Catholic education to continue nurturing your faith.

This week's Gospel speaks about the oil that the foolish virgins ran short of. In Scripture, oil often symbolizes the Holy Spirit. It prompts us to ponder: What is the oil that we may lack in our own lives?

Perhaps, at times, we try to spring into action without first submitting our work and decisions to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We need the oil of discernment and wisdom to ensure our actions are aligned with God's will.

Maybe we find ourselves lacking the oil of kindness and compassion. Without these essential oils, we cannot be fully prepared to meet Jesus in those we encounter. We must strive to extend compassion and mercy to those who cross our paths.

In some instances, we may be short of the oil of patience and sympathy. Without these oils, we are ill-equipped to provide the long-term love and guidance that someone in need might require.

Alternatively, we might be lacking the oil of education and instruction. It's important to continually grow in our faith and acquire the skills necessary to serve others effectively. God may be calling us to take our expertise and skills to another level to better meet Jesus in the people He brings into our lives.

As we journey through these last few weeks of the liturgical year, let us reflect on the oils we may be lacking and ask for the Holy Spirit's guidance to fill our hearts with the virtues and qualities needed to be ready to meet Jesus whenever and wherever He calls us.

May God bless you abundantly as you continue to grow in faith and service.

## MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

### ”SEÑOR, MI ALMA TIENE SED DE TI”

No podemos detener el tiempo y éste pasa volando, los días se van aprisa y los años vuelan. A veces nos preguntamos: ¿Qué fue lo que hice hoy? ¿Qué he hecho en los años que he vivido? La respuesta puede variar, quizá hemos aprovechado todo en la vida, o quizá no hemos logrado todo lo que hubiéramos querido. Pero, hoy, el Evangelio nos invita a estar prevenidos, a estar bien preparados. Nos invita a comenzar de nuevo y llenar nuestra alcuza de aceite con actitudes y valores de acuerdo al Evangelio. A tener esperanza, a estar despiertos para cuando llegue la hora. “Ser sabios y prudentes significa no esperar hasta el último momento para corresponder a la gracia de Dios, sino hacerlo activamente de inmediato, empezar ahora. [...] Si queremos estar preparados para el último encuentro con el Señor, debemos cooperar con él a partir de ahora y realizar buenas acciones inspiradas en su amor” (Papa Francisco 11-08-2020). Si notamos en la parábola, todas las vírgenes se despertaron al escuchar el aviso de que llegaba el novio. Todas ellas deseaban participar en el banquete. Sin embargo, solo las prudentes estaban listas para disfrutar de la boda. Señor, ayúdame, a vivir preparado en todo, que siempre esté listo con buenas obras y tenga tiempo para esperar tu llamada. Actualmente, ¿cómo me preparo para acudir al banquete de la Eucaristía? Estoy puntual, y listo para participar.

## BUSCANDO SABIDURIA

Creo que si a alguno de nosotros nos hicieran la pregunta: “¿Amas la sabiduría? ¿Buscas sabiduría? Responderíamos rápidamente “¡Por supuesto!” sin ninguna duda en nuestras mentes.

Pero una manera diferente de hacer la pregunta es ésta: “¿Estás tomando decisiones acertadas?”

Las vírgenes que salieron al encuentro del novio eran todas iguales. Tenían exactamente las mismas intenciones. Tenían exactamente la misma resistencia, o falta de ella.

¿Qué hizo que cinco fueran distraídas y cinco sabias? Fueron sus elecciones. Sólo sus elecciones los distinguen. Podemos confiar en la sabiduría de otro: el padre que nos recuerda que debemos confesarnos, el amigo que pone reparos cuando empezamos a hablar chismes, el sacerdote que predica con valentía desde el púlpito contra una injusticia que no tenemos el valor de denunciar. Pero incluso si nos sentimos protegidos por su buena influencia, su sabiduría no nos salvará. Es posible que sepamos bien que es difícil navegar en una noche oscura y que necesitamos de una lámpara. Podemos ir a misa de vez en cuando, leer la Biblia cuando tengamos tiempo y servir a los demás cuando sea conveniente. Pero una lámpara necesita aceite para arder en la oscuridad, así como la sabiduría requiere acción para ser llevada al mundo. Podemos amar a Dios tanto como deberíamos: nuestra carne puede desfallecer, nuestra alma puede tener sed. Pero un campo reseco nunca trajo lluvia sobre sí solo por estar seco. Debemos tomar la decisión.
